The E-M-F Registry of the HCCA revival outings brings together owners of E-M-F, Flanders, and related vehicles every two years including Wayne, Northern, Everitt, Tudhope, and brass-era Studebakers.

A few highlights of the week-long tour included a tour of the Amish Stutzman's Wheel Shop, time at the Canton Classic Car Museum, an organ concert and silent movie at the Palace Theater, a tour of Warther's Carving Museum, a visit to Dr. John McAnlis' car collection and the Stan Hywet (Seiberling) mansion.

Also included were some evening events. Most memorable was the presentation on Monday evening by Charles Noyd about the history of the baby E-M-F (present at the tour) and the story of its restoration by Bob Atkinson. Lee Wolff, owner of the baby E-M-F, presented Charles Noyd with a few

original parts that were replaced during restoration of the car, to take back to Stromsburg for their museum. Another evening Daryl & Kathy Kemerer provided a musical interlude, playing piano duet arrangements of old songs in the lobby of the Inn

On Wednesday evening tour participants brought out Show and Tell items to share. This was really interesting and a great way to get to know our fellow tourists.

The closing banquet was an Amish dinner served family style, and was followed by the presentation of the LeRoy Award. The award is named for LeRoy Pelletier, noted for his flamboyant advertising skills, and was presented this year to Jim Gorel for his imaginative, poetic jingle expressing the joy of owning an E-M-F Company automobile. Jim also volunteered to host the next E-M-F Company Outing. Really folks, no arm twisting or bribery was involved! Hope to see you all at the next tour in 2020!!!

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Now these wires were put in by the previous owners of our house and this was not the first time I had run into things like this: I quickly found that the wires between the house and garage were not the type of wire that was meant to be buried under ground. Furthermore, I found that they were aluminum instead of copper. To top it all off, these wires were buried less than 10 inches below the surface of the ground.

So I decided to take my time and do this job the way it should have been done, and include some other improvements as well. These improvements included a new subpanel in basement to tap the garage circuit from, conduit between house and garage buried 18 or more inches down, additional wires between house and garage to allow for control of garage lights from the house, and back yard lights from the garage, and a circuit to better control the furnace in the garage from the house.

So long story short, I spent most of my summer getting all this completed, which prevented me from making any more additional progress on my E-M-F restoration. Will I ever be able to drive my own E-M-F? I wonder sometimes.

New Distribution Method for the Hyphens

In the last couple of years, I have been having more and more problems distributing the electronic copy of the Hyphens via email. This is due to things like SPAM Filters, file attachment size limitations etc.

My frustration got the best of me last issue and I came up with a new way to do the electronic distributions. For those of you reading the electronic version of this issue, you already know this, but for those reading this issue via the paper copy delivered via the US postal service, you may want to try and access the electronic version via the new method.

I have created a location on the E-M-F Homepage website that is not exposed to the public viewing, and can only be accessed if you know the specific location. I did this to protect the personal information, like phone numbers, addresses and email address, from people who would collect such data. I know it is still exposed on the For Sale/Wanted page of the website, but even that data is protected to some degree so that robots cannot come and find it easily.

So how do you access it you ask? Well, at publication time, I still send out an email to the people on my Hyphens Email list with the private URL to access the issue when it is available. This URL will typically be as follows:
