
If you have an idea for a future article, *PLEASE LET ME KNOW*. I am out of ideas.

## Completed the 1909 Sears Motorbuggy Top Project

Well, I reported in the last issue of The Hyphens that I had planned to undertake the fabrication of a top for my father's 1909 Sears Motorbuggy. I know this is not E-M-F Related, but hopefully you will indulge me. I am happy to report that I was able to complete my objective in the timeframe I had hoped for.

My father had restored this car in the 1970'but had never finished the top for the car. He had finished the top bows, but had never covered them. The top had always remained in the down positi9on with a faxboot on it so that it appeared that the top was just down.

For the last couple years, my dad (now 90 years old) has been saying that he really wished he could have driven the car with the top on it just once. So last year I set about trying to make this happen.

I contacted several places that do this kind of work after talking to others who have had this type of work done. All the quotes ended up being more than my dad was willing to spend and more than I could afford.

So I asked him if he would let me make the top. He agreed, and I set about learning how to do this work myself. I looked at 3 different cars to see how the tops were constructed. I then ordered the parts I needed, from fasteners to all the material I needed. I ended up ordering most of the stuff from places like MAC's.

I ventured forward. I built a jig for the bows so I could do most of the work without having the car there, since it was in Southeast Iowa and I am in the Chicago area.

Once I had done all I could on the jig, like cover the bows in bow-drill, fabricate the pads etc., I brought the car into my garage and finished the work.

Is it perfect? No. Would I do some things different next time? Yes. Was my dad happy? YES!

I took it back to him over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend and he drove it out to a car show. He was beaming from ear to ear.

Over the Labor Day weekend, I took the car to the Old Thresher Reunion in Mt. Pleasant, IA. The car had not been at this show in 10 years and has changed a lot since it was last shown. Obviously it now has a top, but it also not has a complete set of correct lights, the correct horn, the correct switch and original style white rubber tires.

My dad, who had not come to the show in 10 years, returned and attended three of the five days. Also, the car was chosen as the feature car for the 2017 reunion, so I get to do it all over again next year!!!

It was time well spent for me and I learned something along the way. Now back to the E-M-F.....
